

# Ashtabula County Metro Park, Camp Peet

## Leave No Trace, Our Camp Use Policy

The camp is protected by Metro Park rules and a State of Ohio Conservation Easement, so rules will be strictly enforced.

Outdoor Ethics: Please remember you are a visitor here and when visiting a friend you would not trample flowers, chop down trees in his yard, put soap in his/her water, or mark your name on his living room wall. It simply means take nothing but pictures and Leave no Trace of activities or litter.

- No ATV's bikes or any wheeled vehicles allowed off the road except for parking.
- Gate will be unlocked only for groups having a permit.
- The Camp is open from dawn until dusk. It is closed and trespassing is not permitted from dusk to dawn for all persons not in possession of a permit.
- No hunting or trapping
- No alcohol, drugs, horse riding or fires.

Group Camping for Youth certain other rules apply.

- Campers must have a permit (see camp usage page) and have at least 2 adults.
- Campers must camp in designated sites 1 to 7. Larger groups may require more than one site.
- Fires must be in fire rings with only one per site. Fire must be out when leaving.
- Firewood cannot be removed from camp.
- No trash service is provided. Take yours home for proper disposal
- There is no water on site, bring your own but refill available within a short driving distance.
- Camper vehicles can park inside gate near their sites and leader will have a gate key.
- Store food securely and keep garbage and food scraps away from animals so they will not acquire bad habits. Never feed wildlife. Help keep wildlife wild.
- Group leaders need to keep gate locked or otherwise maintain control so unwanted traffic is avoided. Leaders also need to be sure no unauthorized vehicles are in camp when leaving.
- Groups need to plan to bring as few vehicles to camp as possible as parking space is LIMITED
